13.) Other Business:

Aaron Atkins spoke on behalf of Doug Toney. The council was questioned as to whether there was support for an ordinance prohibiting living in a tent or in a vehicle. Genesio asked where the individuals where supposed to go. Atkins indicated there are a number of shelters around southern Illinois with availability. It is not safe or sanitary for people to live in their vehicles or tents. Many of them are improvising for facilities rather than walk to a gas station and that is a problem. Ward then said he would rather wait until Du Quoin has something here for them to use as shelter rather than send them to another community. Kirkpatrick inquired the status of the group that was looking into creating such in Du Quoin. The Mayor said their plan for revamping the old REA Clinic had fell through and he did not know if they had a new plan. Karnes said he knows sanitation is a problem but he also knows that getting into housing is not that easy. He had helped an individual previously and it was not that simple. The Mayor stated he had the most experience with low income housing in his 27 year career at the housing authority. Most homeless want to be homeless. Sometimes there isn't anything that can be done.

Mr. Atkins then brought up the topic of animal abuse and cruelty, also on behalf of Doug Toney. He asked if the council would be interested in passing an ordinance so an individual that had animals taken from them due to cruelty would not be allowed to own more animals. The majority of the council was in support and it was decided that Aaron would draft something for a future council meeting.

Solitude Subdivision Addition City of Du Quoin Engineering Review

Add a page 2 to the Plat Plan detailing the following.

A. Utility Detail

- 1. Water—to comply with utility code, Section 39. Install same size water line as already installed, work to be done by licensed plumber. Or, if scheduling in the City Water Department permits, the water line installation could be done by the City. Cost is responsibility of developer.
- 2. Sewage—comply with Code 39-4-10 through 39-4-17. Sewage systems will be the responsibility of the lot owners. Lot owners will need to obtain an application for a permit from Perry County Health Department, which should be prepared by a licensed plumber.

B. Road Details

- 1. Need plan and profile of proposed road, Table 5 A attached. Show details of ditches—crossroad culverts, etc.
- 2. Typical Road Section (no curb and gutter). Table 5 B shows a minimum design of 8" rock with 3" of asphalt or 6" concrete. The existing road is oil and chip: Therefore the City proposes the following: Road width of 24'; subgrade compacted to 95% Standard Proctor Test; 11" compacted CA6 or CA10 to 95% Standard Proctor; A-3 oil and chip surface which requires one prime coat plus three cover seal coats @ 0.25gal/sy HFE 150/RS-2 oil and 25lb/sy CA-16 chips done by Illini Asphalt with last coat to be done the one year after construction.
- 3. Road work needs to be completed and the road needs to be inspected by the developer's engineering firm with a report to the City. Cost is responsibility of developer.
- 4. Since the property in the Addition is not contained in the current city limit, a new legal description of the property needs to be furnished to the City Attorney, Aaron A. Atkins. (The Plat Plan contains this information and appears to be correct.)
- C. The Covenants need to be added to the Plat Plan.
